Our Service Committees: PI/CPC, Communications, Corrections, Treatment/Special Needs, and Grapevine are designed to help us carry the message and make better 12th step work possible.

But what about Archives? How do they help us “carry the message?”

That was the question I struggled with for several years until it hit me:

our Traditions were created from the lessons learned by those who have come before and the record of our past provides evidence that the program works if we work the program. While there are a number of ways Archives helps us carry the message, these are the two that I came to realize. I now believe maintaining documentation of our past is essential for us to ensure our continued future so the hand of AA will always be there.

What does this have to do with contributions? The heating & air (HVAC) unit for the climate controlled archive room in Macon failed and will be replaced. In addition, the Archive Committee

is currently digitizing our historical records to help in their preservation, making historical research easier and these documents more accessible. These are only two examples of how our contributions to GSSA are being used to help “carry the message.”

The questions I leave with you: Are part of your contributions being distributed to GSSA in support of our Service Committees? Does your Group honor our 7th Tradition by supporting the AA Service Structure? Do you know how your contributions are being used to help “carry the message?”

Preserving Your Group History

It is amazing how AA continues to grow and expand around our state, the country and the world. Every edition of the *Georgia Message of AA* contains updates on new groups as they are established around the state. We have already started three new groups in our state this year alone! At the 2015 International we will have the opportunity to see how AA has been founded in countries around the world when we attend the Opening Big Meeting and Flag Ceremony on Friday night!

In Georgia, we have preserved the history of our groups in *We Share* and the upcoming *We Share II*. Another way we preserve our group history is through our own Georgia Archives housed at the state office in Macon. Anyone wanting to research their group

history can go to the Macon office and review these files. This information is documentation of the heart of service at the group level as it includes the month to month happenings at each group. The only way we can obtain information on our group's activities is through the information submitted to us. The most effective way to provide this information is through the submission of your District Minutes. District Minutes can be submitted monthly via email at district-minutes@aageorgia.org. Once the minutes are submitted, a copy is filed in a folder for the District/Zone in the Georgia archives. Please feel free to come to the State Office to review the Archives and YOUR district's folder. Please continue to submit your district minutes to district-minutes@aageorgia.org and keep your group information updated on the aa.org website so those still suffering know when and where to find your group.

To preserve anonymity, the Georgia Message of AA does not contain personal phone numbers, personal email addresses or the password to access protected information on www.aageorgia.org. Here are some tips on how to reach trusted servants:

Factoid: In 1978 the General Service Conference recommended "that a Grapevine information table be made a regular feature at all conferences, conventions, and assemblies."

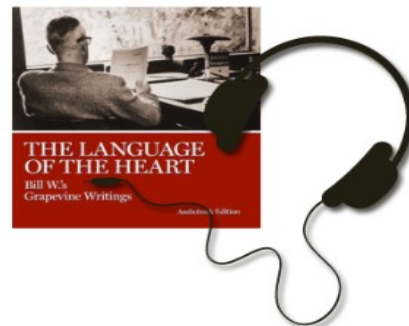

### Supporting Your Archives

The Archives Committee, as with the other committees, is charged with our 5th Tradition's primary purpose of carrying the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. The Archives Committee has an additional task of preserving the message of those who came before us, along with chronicling and preserving our Georgia State Service Assembly documents for those who come after us. As Bill W. put it, "It is highly important that the factual material be placed in our files in such a way that there can be no substantial distortion". These artifacts and records are kept in a climate-controlled repository located within our GSSA office in Macon, Georgia.

With the arrival of Spring, along with heat, humidity and mold, the air conditioning unit that controls the repository, failed. At the time of this writing we have a repair estimate of almost \$1,900.00. There is discus-

sion that it might be better to replace it, as the unit has been giving us problems.

As our collection grows and our digitization effort continues, the time required and incurred expenses have increased. A future view may include a part-time person to keep up with ongoing activities, such as keeping inventories updated, audio digitization, preservation and conservation of documents and artifacts.

Support for your Area 16 Archives comes from the Georgia membership donations to our GSSA. Please keep in mind that your donations to GSSA help assure the preservation of our AA heritage for future generations.

Area 16 Archives has been asked to do a presentation on our Georgia Archives at the International Convention. It is scheduled for Saturday, July 4 at 1:00 PM.

Something Brilliant to Say?

"Practical experience shows that nothing will so much insure immunity from drinking as intensive work with other alcoholics. It works when other activities fail. This is our *twelfth suggestion*: Carry this message to other alcoholics! You can help when no one else can. You can secure their confidence when others fail. Remember they are very ill." *Alcoholics Anonymous*, Page 89.

When I first started going into the prisons, I felt like I had to say something that was going to change the lives of all the men I met. I was always trying to think of the special topic for discussion, for something brilliant to say, for the right words to come out of my mouth that would put me right up

there with the spiritual giants. After some years, I have found that the men are impressed by me simply showing up week after week and being sober. I am simply a "seed planter." I share my story, and where the seed of AA is planted and where it grows is the business of a Higher Power. I may never see the results of my 12th Step work in others, but I definitely can see it in myself: I am sober for another day to try to carry the message to another alcoholic.

Our fellowship must be self-supporting. We offer a suggested support plan for the GSRs to share with their groups. By being self-supporting, we can fully discharge our responsibilities to our beautiful fellowship in Georgia.

In those Districts and Zones where there is no central office, we suggest that the income, after all group expenses have been paid, be allocated as follows:

State Office, Macon	50%
GSO	30%
Pre-Paid Convention	10%
District/Zone	10%

In Atlanta, Augusta and any other District/Zone which supports a central office, we suggest that the income, after all group expenses have been paid, be allocated as follows:

Central Office	35%
State Office, Macon	30%
GSO	20%
Pre-Paid Convention	10%
District/Zone	5%
